

The IEREST Project meets these needs by developing, testing and disseminating an Intercultural Path (namely, a set of teaching modules) to be provided to Erasmus students before, during, and after their experience abroad, in order to encourage learning mobility and to support students in benefiting as much as possible from their international experiences in terms of personal growth and intercultural competencies.

Outgoing students from IEREST partner universities have the opportunity to receive intercultural support before, during and after their study abroad experience (Modules 1, 2.1, and 3).

Exchange students moving to one of the partner institutions can also attend a module in the host university (Module 2.2).

The intercultural path will be tested in four IEREST institutions (University of Bologna, Durham University, Primorska University, University of Leuven).
